About the Yinson4Youth Grant (Y4Y Grant)

“Amplifying the initiatives of passionate and change-making youth”

Yinson4Youth (Y4Y Grant) provides funding to support youth-led projects that are aligned with our sustainability focus areas and aim to bring about **positive social and environmental transformation within Malaysia**.

We recognise that youths, with their innovative and dynamic mindset, are key to driving and delivering lasting positive change as we build toward a sustainable and resilient future. All around the world, passionate and courageous young changemakers are pioneering initiatives with profound and enduring impacts in the communities they serve.

Yinson, in alignment with our purpose of nurturing a capable local workforce, bolstering the regional economy, and ensuring the preservation of the natural environment, aims to lend tangible support to **amplify the initiatives of passionate and change-making youth** through this grant.

Y4Y AT A GLANCE

- A maximum of four (4) grants is to be awarded to four (4) projects, with a value of up to RM50,000 each.
- Projects must be youth-led, i.e. the majority of persons driving the project must be between the ages of 18 to 30.
- The implementation period of the project is between **February 2026 and August 2026**. However, the duration may vary based on the project's scope and scale.
- Applications are open to registered non-governmental organisations, non-profit organisations, social enterprises, and societies from private and public tertiary academic institutions.
- Projects should contribute to social or environmental change and align with one or more of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals that Yinson focuses on.



What will the successful grant recipient receive?

1. Grant of up to RM50,000

Depending on the duration and nature of the project, each grant recipient will be awarded up to RM50,000 per project. As part of the evaluation process, all applications will need to include an indication of how the grant will be spent.

The grant will be disbursed in two parts. The first half of the grant will be disbursed at the start of the project, with the remainder released at the halfway point.

2. Mentorship

Recipients will also benefit from the 1-to-1 mentorship of a professional from Yinson who will help guide the recipient in the development of their initiative. The mentorship session is on a needs-based basis. Grant recipients are recommended to have as many sessions as possible with their respective mentors whenever their guidance is sought after.

Starting from the evaluation process to the quarterly reporting, Yinson's team will work together with grant recipients to identify areas where Yinson would be able to add value, and this informational support will be built into the project plan and execution. Such areas may include strategy development, industry insights, leadership development and marketing & communications.



What are the grant recipient's responsibilities?

1. Delivering on the project

Grant recipients are responsible for meeting the deliverables of the project as specified and agreed on the contract.

2. Reporting requirements

Grant recipients must provide quarterly updates on the project, which will include progress against the **deliverables, challenges faced, project expenditures** and **pictures/videos** taken during the implementation of the project.

Upon completion, grant recipients must complete Yinson's Project Impact Report.

The quantifiable impacts below should be included in both the quarterly and closing report, in addition to other project-specific measurables:

- i) Number of lives impacted.
- ii) Number of communities impacted.
- iii) Number of cumulative volunteering hours to Yinson employees.

We believe this close communication will be mutually beneficial, as it offers Yinson a better understanding of the support we can offer.

3. Budget utilisation

The proposed total expenditure should be realistic, cost-efficient, and must not exceed **RM50,000**. Eligible costs include:

- i) operation of project activities,
- ii) equipment and supplies,
- iii) communications, and
- iv) other relevant project-related expenses.

Non-eligible costs, which will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis, include:

- i) salaries and allowances, and
- ii) contributions in kind.

All proposed amounts should be stated in local currency, and a justification for the budget breakdown should be provided where necessary.



4. Final presentation

Grant recipients must present the project outcomes to Yinson's committee at the conclusion of the project to formally wrap up the project.

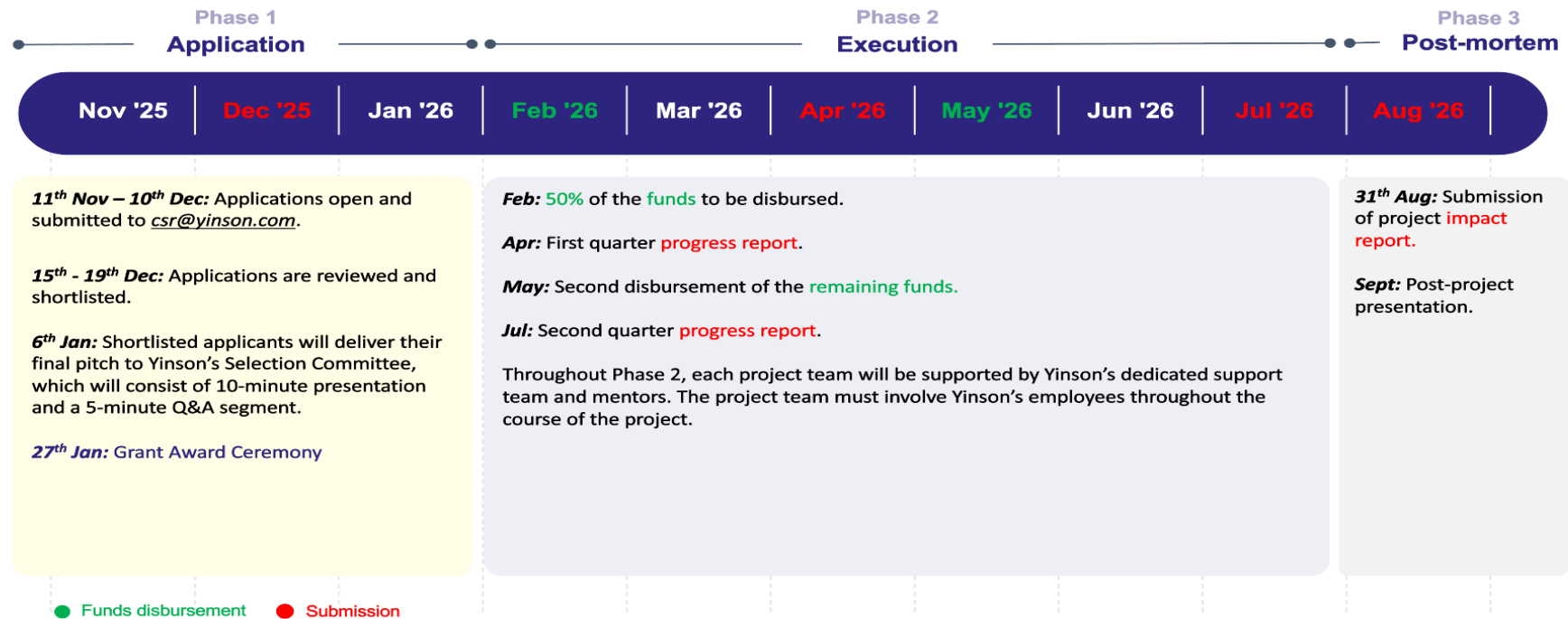
5. Volunteering opportunities for Yinson employees

Employee volunteerism is an important way that Yinson seeks to add value to projects while allowing Yinson employees to participate in meaningful activities in the community. The grant recipients must provide volunteering opportunities for Yinson employees to be part of the project.

Project Criteria

1. Youth-led

The project shall be primarily youth-led, with at least 50% of core project team members aged between 18 to 30 at the date of the grant application.

The youths who are driving the project should be part of a registered organisation that fall under the following categories:

- Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs);
- Non-Profit Organisations;
- Social Enterprises; and
- Societies from public or private tertiary education institutions.

**Organisations must not have any affiliations based on political or religious beliefs.*

2. Champions sustainable social or environmental change

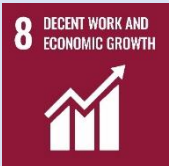
The project should address pressing community, social and environmental issues and seek to bring about long-term, positive change.

3. Local focus

The project led by the organisation should have a team based in Malaysia and specifically focus on making an impact within the Malaysian region.

4. Aligned with UN SDGs

Yinson aligns our activities to 9 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDG) where we believe we have the biggest potential to leave an impact. Hence, the projects should focus on the SDGs listed in the table below:

Note: The project must align with at least one of the 9 SDGs listed above. If the project contributes to multiple SDGs, it is eligible as long as at least one of the SDGs is listed above.

5. Clear objectives, project plan and quantifiable impacts

Criteria that are considered when evaluating the applications include the following:

- The project clearly identifies the social or environmental issue it targets and how the project addresses it, backed by input from relevant stakeholders or subject area specialists.
- The applicant demonstrates strong organisational capacity through a well-thought-out and realistic project plan, including a detailed, cost-efficient, realistic and well-substantiated budget plan.
- The project outlines a clear monitoring plan for quantifiable impacts, as listed in *'Reporting Requirements'* on page 6.

6. Project Novelty

Projects that are new to Yinson, the proposing organisation, the industry, or the country and that have the potential to be tailored to Yinson's CSR objectives may have a higher likelihood of being shortlisted, provided they demonstrate strong feasibility and quality. However, this is not a strict requirement and remains optional for organisations to adopt.

FAQ

1. What do you mean by a youth-led project?

The project shall be primarily youth-led, with at least 50% of core project team members aged between 18 to 30 at the date of the grant application. The age criteria are fixed, but leaders above the age of 30 should take on advisory roles and empower young people in the organisation to lead the project.

2. Can I apply as an individual?

No, you will have to apply as a registered organisation under the following categories:

- Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs);
- Non-Profit Organisations;
- Social Enterprises; and
- Society from a public or private tertiary academic institutions.

3. Can previous Y4Y grant recipients reapply?

Yes, previous Y4Y grant recipients are welcome to reapply. However, the organisation must complete the full application process again, and the final decision will be based on the quality of the proposed project relative to other applications received this year.

4. Must all members of the project be Malaysian?

No, not all members of the project must be Malaysian. However, the project's impact must be locally based.

5. What will be application be judged on?

Your application will be judged on the perceived quality, feasibility and value-added of the project. The factors taken into consideration during the evaluation will be based on how well your project aligns with our list of project criteria (*refer [here](#).*).

6. What is the shortlisting process like?

Once all applications are received, they will be reviewed and shortlisted by Yinson's team. Shortlisted applicants will be given at least 2 weeks of notice for an interview with Yinson's CSR Committee, which will consist of a 10-minute presentation segment and a 5-minute Q&A segment.



7. Will I have full ownership of the project?

Yes, you would have complete ownership of the project. However, Yinson should be acknowledged as the main and only sponsor of the project.

8. How will the information that I provide be used?

Personal information (excluding those project-related ones) provided during the grant application, project execution and post-project wrap-up will be deemed confidential, unless stated otherwise. All personal data collected shall be in compliance with our Group Privacy Policy as exhibited on Yinson's website. Should there be any requirement to use the information provided, consent will be requested.

9. How do I submit an application?

If you wish to apply, kindly ensure you meet the eligibility and project criteria and understand the requirements listed in this information booklet.
